



In the late 1990s an 18 year-old girl was raped by her 45 year-old driving instructor in Italy. The court convicted him, but the judge overturned the conviction arguing, "Because the victim wore very, very tight jeans, she had to help him remove them...and by removing the jeans...it was no longer rape but consensual sex."

Angered by this verdict, members of the Italian Parliament began wearing jeans in protest. Denim Day has become a world wide event that calls to community members & elected officials to stand with survivors of sexual assault to wear denim.
