Using photos, audio recordings, and video clips, a recreation of the sixteen- month process will be presented to illustrate how VRA compliance and county programs worked in cooperation to produce a successful conclusion to this case. First person accounts of assault itself, law enforcement investigation, and prosecution will be given. The far-reaching implications of this crime in the rural community of Greeley highlight the positive changes that have taken place over the last eight years in the 19th Judicial District.</p>
