CCASA also strengthened and expanded our capacity to engage and support members through our new Regional Training and Assistance Program, and development of information and resources available through our website, blog, and web-based training. The Board of Directors worked to ensure a smooth transition in leadership as CCASA said good-bye to Erin Jemison, who served as CCASA's Executive Director for over five years. Together with our members and partners, CCASA's Board and Staff look forward to continuing to move CCASA's mission forward into the next 30 years! Thank you!

2014 HIGHLIGHTS

- Led efforts to pass legislation that provides civil legal protections for victims who have a child as a result of rape.
- Worked with multi-disciplinary partners to ensure a victim-centered process in compliance with HB 13-1020, including creating guidelines for best practices in victim notification, when testing of "backlogged" sexual assault evidence provides new information that may result in the re-opening of a case."
- Worked with a multi-disciplinary group of partners to develop a new publication, *Your Reporting Options: For Victims of Unwanted Sexual Experiences*, which is intended to help victims understand the scope of their choices following a sexual assault.
- Launched our new Regional Training and Assistance Program (RTAP), which leverages victim/survivor advocates within Colorado communities in order to provide on-the-ground, in-person training and technical assistance to CCASA members.
- Released *Survivor Stories*, a training video for professionals working with survivors of sexual violence.
- Updated CCASA's Survivor Handbook, *Toward Healing and Justice*.
- Continued to partner with the Sexual Assault Response Project (SARP) at the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ) to provide ongoing expert consultation to SARP grantees on SART development and emerging issues.
- Continued to collaborate with Just Detention International (JDI) to provide expert consultation on sexual assault advocacy for incarcerated victims.
- Co-chaired the Colorado Sex Offender Management Board (SOMB)'s School Reference Guide revision committee and provided extensive consultation on a victim-centered approach to update their *Reference Guide for School Personnel Concerning Juveniles Who Have Committed Sexually Abusive and Offending Behavior*.
- Launched a re-design of our website, ccasa.org, which is more interactive, engaging and user-friendly to CCASA members and stakeholders, with increased access to Spanish pages, research and articles, the CCASA Blog, documents and forms, and statewide and national resources.
- Collaborated with the Colorado Coalition Against Domestic Violence (CCADV) to host the third annual Colorado Advocacy in Action conference, which included more than 200 participants from every region of the state.
- Continued to support our members, partners, survivors, and communities in Colorado by:
 - » Providing training to almost 1,300 members and partners in order to help ensure a consistent, comprehensive, and victim-centered response to sexual assault.
 - » Fulfilling over 360 requests for technical assistance regarding sexual assault response issues.
 - » Publishing and distributing over 3,500 copies of brochures, handbooks, manuals, reports, and videos, in English and Spanish, regarding sexual assault, available services, and resources for responding to sexual assault.

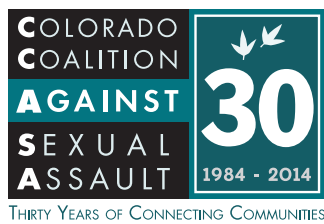
